Big Maria Communication Site

Overview

The site is located approximately 11 miles north of Blythe and 0.50 mile west of Highway 95 on a low ridge overlooking the Colorado River Valley. The site is located within an existing communication tower complex that houses approximately six towers and support buildings, including an existing County tower facility. The proposed project will replace the existing facility with an upgraded tower and new equipment shelter.

Surrounding Land Uses

The site is located within a rural desert area overlooking the Colorado River Valley. Highway 95 lies approximately 0.50 mile east of the site, with agricultural fields lying east of the highway and continuing to the Colorado River, approximately 1.25 miles from the site. The site is located within an existing communication tower complex. The tower facility lies immediately adjacent to the eastern boundary of the 45,367-acre Big Maria Mountains Wilderness Area.

Topography and Vegetation

There is extensive disturbance at the communications site including the towers already present at the location. The general topography of the area is mountainous, with hills overlooking the Colorado River floodplain. Vegetation in the area includes creosote and occasional barrel cactus, although vegetation is generally sparse. There is minimal soil development, consisting of broken rock; and the geology of the area includes volcanic and metamorphic rocks characteristic of this desert area.

Land Ownership and Applicable Habitat/Land Management Plan


The site is located on federal land managed by the BLM. The site is managed by the Yuma Field Office of the BLM and is subject to the Yuma Field Office Resource Management Plan.

Commercial Power Access


Commercial power is already available at the site to serve the existing communication complex.




